Lake level pretty much the same level since the first measurement on May 6th.

Have had over 12 inches of rain since the May 6th.

Best clarity reading was 22 feet. Lowest reading was 16 feet.

Boat landing has been re-graded and the pier repaired.

Algae worse than normal this year. No real reason. Combination of weather and pollen.

Treasure Report presented by Dennis Flanagan.

Our grant funding for weed treatment has run out. We will continue to apply and hope for further future funding becomes available.

The District should be able to fund treatments with the normal assessment income without raising the current taxation amount.
