Lake Management Report

There was discussion concerning applying for a new grant through the DNR for invasive species weed control. Chairman Frickleton offered to begin the grant application process. The board approved to move forward with the grant application process. Chairman Frickleton was authorized by the board to effect the application documentation.

Mike Backus encouraged participation at for the Lake Management planning meeting. The meeting is open to all lake district residents. This meeting is intended to provide the vision to the future and monitor progress against current goals. The group meets one hour prior to our regularly quarterly meetings. They will begin again this Spring due to Covid concerns.

Lake level down 1 ½ inches since this Spring. At one point we were down over 5 inches.

Walleye stocking occurs in odd numbered years.

Natural vegetation seems to be higher than normal.

The timing and conditions for the lake treatment should point to a successful treatment.
